Chaska Officers issued 40 citations and 53 warnings during this reporting period

DWI:

Officer Meyer stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation in the area of Maxwell Lane and Schoolmaster Drive. The female driver was intoxicated. She failed field sobriety evaluations and was arrested for DWI.

Disturbances:

An officer observed a male standing on the side of Yellow Brick Road. The male was intoxicated and was staggering. He then began yelling obscenities at other people in a nearby parking lot. The officer made contact with the male, who had a 40oz beer in his possession. A breath test indicated a .192 BAC. He was placed in a detox facility.



A man and woman returned home after drinking at a bar. They began arguing over the woman's adult daughter, who was living with them. The man threw items around their home. He then struck the woman with a frying pan. Police responded and found the man hiding in weeds near the home. The man was arrested and charged with domestic assault and 5th degree assault.

Officers responded to a suspicious vehicle in a parking lot. An intoxicated male was sleeping inside the vehicle. He submitted to a breath test and the result was a .228 BAC. He was not in possession of the vehicle's keys. He was placed in a detox facility.

A man left his two young children (ages six and four) home alone for a period of time, while he picked up his vehicle from a shop. Officers received a complaint and responded to the residence. The man was charged with child endangerment.

A woman physically assaulted her husband after he called her names and threatened to end their marriage. The woman made suicidal comments to officers. She was placed on a health and welfare hold and was transported to a hospital. She was charged with domestic assault.

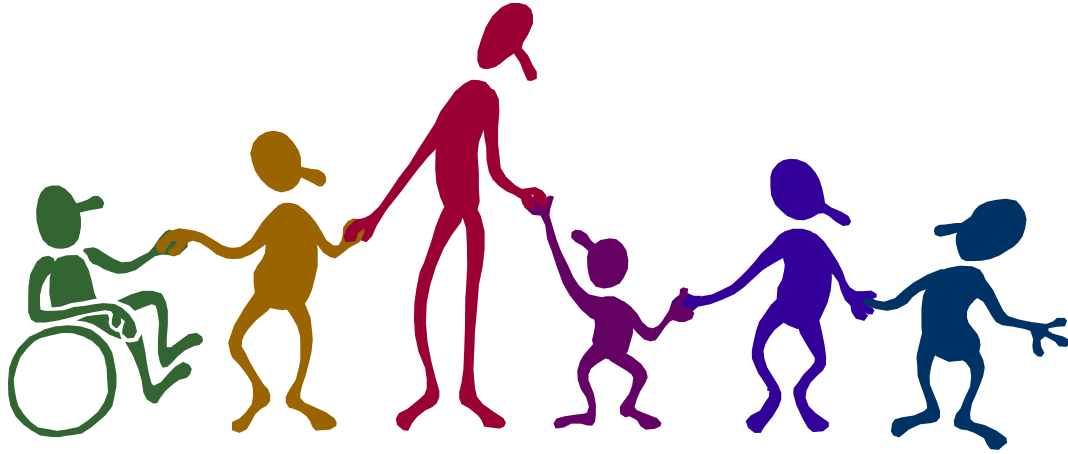
