PORTION OF HUNDERTMARK ROAD TO CLOSE

Beginning Monday, June 14th, the City of Chaska will be closing the section of Hundertmark Road east of Highway 41 and west of Cortina Woods for a full reconstruction project. While this section of road is officially closed, there will still be access into the SuperAmerica Station located at the intersection of Hwy 41 and Hundertmark.

This project is in conjunction with the new 212 Medical Center being constructed to the south. Widening of the road, putting in dual left hand turn lanes, and a signal at the Medical Center entrance will all help move traffic more efficiently through this area. As part of this project, the entrance to SuperAmerica will be shifted slightly to the east to make it align with the Medical Center entrance to the south. With these improvements, the City anticipates that issues residents have been experiencing in the past with the stacking of traffic along Hundertmark will be alleviated. Also at this time the City will be overlaying the remainder of Hundertmark Road between Cortina Woods and Pioneer Trail. Residents of the Cortina Woods neighborhood will need to enter their neighborhood from the north along Pioneer Trail. The road project should be completed by Thanksgiving, with the majority of the work occurring this summer.

SOLICITOR UPDATE



When does a person need a solicitor's permit? Whenever that person is going door-to-door and making face-to-face contact with

residents. Persons who are distributing flyers, with no personal contact, are not required to have a permit from the City. Peddlers and transients operating a temporary business such as ice cream trucks, or corn stands, are also required to have a permit. These permits may be obtained from Chaska City Hall for the low economical rate of \$38 and are good for the entire year after approval by the Council!

Residents who have a solicitor come to their door may ask to see his/her permit, which they should have on their person. If they do not have a permit, you may contact the Chaska Police and report the violation by calling 911.

JULY 4TH FIREWORKS

On Sunday, July 4th, the City of Chaska will once again be hosting the community fireworks display on the upper portion of Jonathan Lake, north of McKnight Park. The best viewing will be from McKnight Park overlooking the lake or from the Chaska Commons parking area. Much of the financial support for the fireworks is generously donated by several local organizations and businesses. Any questions about the event may be directed to the Chaska City Administrator.
