### NEW CABLE EQUIPMENT IN USE

The Monday, June 21<sup>st</sup> meeting of the Chaska City Council marked the first evening that the Chaska Cable Access Channel used the newly installed audio video equipment in the Council Chambers. We are excited about this new communication technology to provide our residents with another means of obtaining information and we hope your viewing experience will be enhanced.

The original equipment had been in place since the construction of the Council Chambers in 1987. This spring the equipment finally quit working, requiring the replacement of the entire system. Chaska was fortunate to have received grant funds that were able to be utilized for the new equipment so there was no impact on the current General Fund Budget. With the implementation of the new equipment, residents should experience a much more clear picture, better sound quality, and the ability to view information being presented to the Council at an up close range.



As the new system continues to be utilized, residents are encouraged to provide the City with feedback on the quality of the new cable equipment. We are aware that there were issues on the first night of filming with the tone of the color on the television screen. We appreciate your comments as we become more comfortable with the equipment and learn how to tweak the system.
