## Around the Clock -Sgt. Ben Anderson

Chaska Officers issued 15 citations and 14 warnings during this reporting period.

There were 230 calls for service

### DWI:

A vehicle was stopped after an officer observed lane violations on Pioneer Trail. The female driver was intoxicated and was arrested. She was charged with 4<sup>th</sup> degree DWI and minor consumption of alcohol. A male passenger, who is the owner of the vehicle, was cited for aiding in the commission of a traffic offense (underage drinking and driving).



A vehicle was driving erratically through a parking lot and almost struck a police squad car, which was driving through the area. The officer stopped the vehicle and spoke to the male driver, who was intoxicated. The male driver was arrested and charged with DWI.

### Disturbances:

Police received complaints in reference to solicitors on Falls Curve and Ridge Bluff Drive. Officers located the three solicitors, who were attempting to sell magazines in the area without city-issued permits. The three offenders were cited for soliciting without a permit.



Officers responded to the area of Fourth Street and Pine Street, in reference to a personal injury accident involving a vehicle and a pedestrian. The injured pedestrian ran into traffic and into a moving truck. Emergency personnel arrived and transported the victim to a hospital for minor injuries. No citations were issued.

A male was walking through the Chaska City Hall parking lot while carrying/drinking an open bottle of Smirnoff Vodka. An officer observed the male and stopped him. He was cited for consuming liquor on public property.

A juvenile male was walking in the crosswalk in the area of Hundertmark Road and Bavaria Road. While standing in the roadway, the male used profanity toward a motorist. An officer was in the area and observed the incident. The male was cited and referred to juvenile court for disorderly conduct.

Spring Cleaning Time!



Emergency personnel responded to a report of a house on fire in the 1300 block of Broadview Avenue. Upon arriving, police and firefighters learned the residence was not on fire, but a large fire was burning in the backyard. The male homeowner told officers it was his "cleaning day", so he had started a large fire in order to burn items. The burning items included sofa cushions, blankets and general household trash. The fire was approximately eight feet behind the residence. The heat from the fire was so intense, it melted a cover to a propane grill that was in the yard. The Chaska Fire Department extinguished the fire, due to the lack of any access the homeowner had to water in the yard. There were no yard hoses or any other access to water in that area. The homeowner was cited for illegal burning less than 25 feet from a structure, and for burning illegal materials.
