**Around the Clock

Chaska Officers issued 38 citations and 38 warnings during this reporting period. There were 256 calls for service

DWI:

Officer Pesheck stopped a vehicle for failing to signal a turn and lane violations on County Road 61. The female driver was intoxicated and failed field sobriety evaluations. A breath test indicated a .226 BAC. She was arrested and charged with 2nd degree DWI. Her vehicle is subject to forfeiture. This is her third DWI arrest in the past three years. She was convicted of DWI in 2007 and 2009.

Disturbances:

An intoxicated male was upset and out of control at a residence on Crosstown Blvd. His wife called 9-1-1 and officers arrived. The male got into a bathroom shower and turned the water on. He refused to exit the bathroom and continually yelled and swore at officers. Officers finally entered the unlocked bathroom and took him into custody. He was charged with obstructing the legal process without force. The result of a breath test was a .106 BAC.



The Community Park pavilion was damaged after shingles were pulled off the roof. A witness reported numerous juveniles had climbed onto the roof and caused the damage. They left the area prior to police arrival.



Police received a report of a vehicle driving into construction road barriers in the area of Hundertmark Road and Manuela Drive. The vehicle was located a short time later and two occupants were inside. The male driver had consumed alcohol and was under the age of 21. He was cited for underage drinking and driving.

Officers responded to a residence on Dustin Circle for an unwanted male. The male, who was intoxicated and related to the homeowner, was attempting to enter the residence. Officers located the man and attempted to take him into custody. He resisted arrest and fought with police. He was subdued and arrested. A breath test indicated a .22 BAC. He was placed in a detox facility. He was charged with obstructing the legal process with force.
