2010 Decennial Census



The decennial census data is used to reapportion the seats of the U.S. House of Representatives, and realign the boundaries of the legislative districts of each state. Census data are also used to allocate more than \$400 billion each year in federal financial assistance and to provide a social, demographic, and economic profile of our Nation's people.

In an effort to accurately count our population, census questionnaires will be delivered, either by hand or mail, to you beginning in February. Through late August, Census Bureau temporary field staff will work in neighborhoods to deliver questionnaires, collect information from those who have not returned their census questionnaire, and verify addresses.

Each and every Census Bureau employee will carry official identification.

If you are unsure about anyone who comes to your door, and/or would like a Chaska police officer to verify that his or her identification is valid Census Bureau issue, please call "911". An officer can be at your home within minutes.

No Census Bureau employee will ever have a legitimate reason to enter your home, and will not ask to enter. Should any anyone come to your door, and want to enter your home for "census taking purposes", you should deny access, lock your door, and call "911".

Chaska Officers issued 48 citations and 32 warnings during this reporting period

Disturbances:

A vehicle was stolen from a residence on Michelle Avenue. The offender had stolen the victim's cell phone, cash and car keys prior to the car theft. Investigation continues.

Two juvenile males stole numerous items from a grocery store and attempted to quickly exit the building. A female employee witnessed the theft and attempted to stop them. They pushed the female into a door and ran from the store. Police located the two offenders a short time later. They were charged with theft and 5th degree assault.



A burglary occurred at a business on Pine Street. Evidence was collected from the scene for processing.



Emergency personnel responded to a vehicle crash with possible injuries on Hazeltine Blvd. A male driver was found at the scene and was not injured. He told officers he was driving and swerved to miss a dog, which had run into the road. In doing so, he crashed his vehicle into a tree. Officers observed the damage to the vehicle and the tree. The damage to the vehicle was not consistent with hitting the tree. Missing parts from the vehicle were not found at the scene. After further questioning, the male admitted he had staged the accident, in order to cover the car damage sustained in a crash from the past night. He had rear-ended another vehicle while driving intoxicated the night before and had left without stopping. He was cited for careless driving. The MN State Patrol was contacted and is investigating the first crash.
