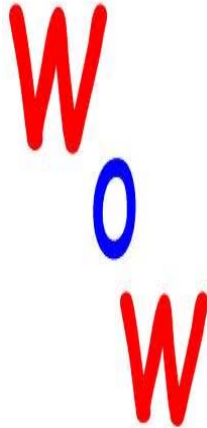

## Around the Clock -Sgt. Ben Anderson

**Chaska Officers issued 58 citations and 54 warnings during this reporting period.  
There were 311 calls for service**

### DWI:

Officer Pesheck stopped a vehicle on Hwy 41 for speeding, driving erratically, following too closely to another vehicle and crossing fog/centerlines. The male driver was intoxicated and failed field sobriety evaluations. He was arrested and charged with 4<sup>th</sup> degree DWI and driving after suspension.



An intoxicated man reported he was robbed and hit in the head with an unknown object while walking in downtown Chaska. He had a contusion on his head and vomit on his clothing. His statements were inconsistent and he was incoherent. Police determined his injuries were likely the result of being overly intoxicated and falling. A breath test indicated a .202 BAC. He was placed on a health and welfare hold after making suicidal statements to police. He was also cited for possession of marijuana.

An intoxicated male drove his vehicle to the Chaska Community Center. He parked the vehicle and entered the building. While inside he fell numerous times, prompting concerned employees to call police. The male was arrested for DWI after failing field sobriety evaluations.

Approximately 70 gallons of gas was siphoned from three parked trucks outside of a U-haul store.

### Disturbances:

A juvenile male brandished a knife and chased two other juvenile males during an altercation near City Square Park. Officers found the male and placed him under arrest without incident. The offender told police the other males were taunting him, which led to the chase. He was transported to jail and charged with 2<sup>nd</sup> degree assault, possession of dangerous weapons in a park zone and disorderly conduct.



At approximately 2:00 AM one morning, an officer observed a suspicious male standing outside Snap Fitness. There were no lights on inside the business. The male attempted to pull open the front door several times, but was unsuccessful. He then pulled flowers out from a pot and threw them at the front door. He continued by grabbing a bicycle rack and attempted to drag it onto the sidewalk. The officer made contact with the male and identified him. The officer asked him what he was doing by the building. The male replied he was "looking for fish, like walleyes and crayfish". He also stated he could not find his bicycle. A breath test indicated a .22 BAC. He was placed in a detox facility. His bicycle was later found, not surprisingly, locked to a tree outside of a bar in downtown Chaska.

Police responded to a domestic assault complaint in the area of Bavaria Rd and Engler Blvd. A woman punched the father of her child, after seeing him talking to another woman. She then left the area prior to police arrival. She was charged with domestic assault.
