Citizen Corps was created to help coordinate volunteer activities to make communities safer, stronger, and better prepared to respond to any emergency situation. It provides opportunities for people to participate in a range of measures to make their families, their homes, and their communities safer from threats of crime, terrorism, and disasters of all kinds.

Citizen Corps partner programs build on the successful efforts in place in many communities around the country to prevent crime and respond to emergencies. Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS) and Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) are two of five Citizen Corps partner programs.



The Chaska Police Department is excited to announce a VIPS and CERT program starting soon. The VIPS Program provides support and resources for the police department and is for citizens who wish to volunteer their time and skills with a community law enforcement agency.



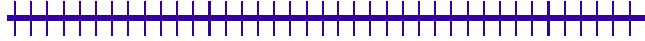
The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community. This program will involve an 8-week training program that will meet two hours per week.

Around the Clock

DWI:

Officer Juell stopped a vehicle for speeding and lane violations in the area of Bavaria Road and Hundertmark Road. The female driver was intoxicated and failed field sobriety evaluations. A breath test indicated a .211 BAC. She was arrested for 2nd degree DWI.

Police received a call of a vehicle, which had driven off the roadway on Ravoux Road. The vehicle was occupied and stuck in a snow bank. The female driver was present when officers arrived. She was intoxicated and was arrested for DWI. A bottle for vodka was found inside the vehicle. She was charged with DWI and minor possession of alcohol.



Officer George stopped a vehicle after observing it speeding with loud exhaust on Chaska Boulevard. The male driver admitted to consuming alcohol and failed field sobriety evaluations. He was arrested for DWI and a breath test indicated a .18 BAC. The male has two prior DWI convictions and his vehicle is subject to forfeiture.

An obviously intoxicated male was attempting to pump gas into his vehicle at a gas station. He was stumbling and tripping near his vehicle. Police were notified and were given information in reference to the vehicle as it left the store. The vehicle was located and stopped a short time later. The male was extremely intoxicated and failed field sobriety evaluations. He was arrested for 2nd degree DWI and the breath test result was a .24 BAC. His vehicle is subject to forfeiture as he has two prior DWI convictions in the past ten years.



Disturbances:

Officers responded to a burglary in progress call at a residence on Prairie Street. The suspect attempted to force entry into the residence while the homeowner was inside. The homeowner called 9-1-1 and the suspect ran from the area prior to police arrival. Investigation continues.

Two female students became involved in a verbal altercation at the Chaska High School between classes. The altercation became physical when one female grabbed the other's hair, pushed her down and punched her face numerous times. The offending female was charged with 5th degree assault.

A mother and her seventeen-year old son argued at their residence over the use of the family's vehicle. The son pushed his mother to the ground and attempted to prevent her from calling 9-1-1. Police arrived and arrested the son for domestic assault and interfering with a 9-1-1 call.

An intoxicated male attempted to provoke a fight with another patron at Kelley's Bar. Employees attempted to restrain him and called the police, who arrived shortly thereafter. The male was yelling, swearing and foaming at the mouth as officers took him into custody. He was extremely intoxicated and admitted to being addicted to methamphetamine. The result of a breath test was a .246 BAC. The male was charged with disorderly conduct and placed in a detoxification facility.

A juvenile male chased down and assaulted another juvenile male after they exited a school bus on Von Herten Circle. The offending male punched and kicked the victim several times. Police responded to the area and charged the offender with 5th degree assault.
