The class participated in seven different topics including: DWI and Drug Enforcement, Chaska CSI, School Resource Officer and Gang Presentation, Traffic Stops, Use of Force and a tour of the Carver County Court Rooms and a presentation by the County Attorneys Office. The class also visited the Carver County Jail and Dispatch center.

We want to increase partnerships with those in our community and create opportunities to receive feedback from participants to improve our delivery of services. Often there is little opportunity for the average citizen to have police contact without having a need or problem to solve. The academy offers an opportunity for both citizens and officers to share views and ideas.
