Chaska Officers issued 21 citations and 16 warnings during this reporting period. There were 118 calls for service

DWI:
Officer Meyer stopped a vehicle for speed and lane violations in the area of Crosstown Blvd and Yellow Brick Road. The female driver was intoxicated, failed field sobriety evaluations and was arrested for DWI.

A female driver failed to dim the headlights of her vehicle while driving on Engler Blvd. Officer Kjorstad stopped the vehicle and arrested the driver for DWI and driving after suspension.



Disturbances:

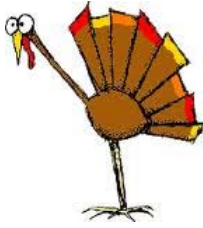
A group of friends were socializing at a residence on Engler Blvd. A woman became upset and punched three of her friends numerous times, then left the residence prior to police arrival. Officers located her the next day. The woman stated she had been very intoxicated and remembers punching some of her friends. She was remorseful and stated it would not happen again. She was cited for 5th degree assault.



A woman crashed her vehicle into another in the area of Pioneer Trail and Audubon Road. She drove away from the scene, making no attempt to stop or provide information to the other driver. Her license plate was recorded and given to police, who located her a short time later. She was charged with leaving the scene of a property damage accident.

Police received a domestic assault complaint involving a father and his five-year old son. Through investigation, officers learned the father had struck the child's shoulder leaving a bruise. The father was arrested for domestic assault.

A woman and her live-in boyfriend were arguing over upcoming Thanksgiving plans at their residence. The boyfriend was intoxicated and pushed her down several times while grabbing her neck. He was arrested and charged with domestic assault.



Three juvenile males became involved in a confrontation outside of the Clover Ridge Elementary School. One male threatened the two others with a knife. Police arrived and arrested the male who possessed the knife. He was charged with 2nd degree assault, possession of a dangerous weapon on school grounds and disorderly conduct. The two other males were cited for 5th degree assault and disorderly conduct.

What's on your arm?

During a routine driver's license check, an officer learned a male had numerous active arrest warrants. The male denied his identity and gave a false name to the officer. However, the officer did not believe him due to one simple fact. The male had his name tattooed on his arm, which was visible to the officer. The tattooed taleteller was arrested on the warrants and was also charged with providing false information to a police officer.

Stop Vehicle Thefts

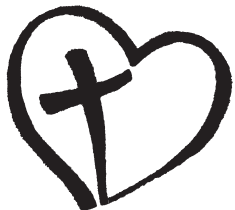
