“Face 2 Face”



The Chaska Police Department is holding its first dialogue for teens called “Face 2 Face”. It will take place Friday, November 5th at the Chaska Community Center from 6 PM to 9:30 PM. This program, open to up to 200 teens, is designed to give teens in 8th through 12th grade an opportunity to speak with officers and be able to ask, “Everything they wanted to know about the Police but were afraid to ask” and Q & A with Police. Topics include search and arrest, drugs, alcohol, search warrants, gangs and more. Police will be role-playing with the teens, allowing the teens to be the police in scenarios, creating a rapport with the youth. The night will include youth entertainment, food and door prizes.

Exciting New Programs Coming Soon



Citizen Corps was created to help coordinate volunteer activities to make communities safer, stronger, and better prepared to respond to any emergency situation. It provides opportunities for people to participate in a range of measures to make their families, their homes, and their communities safer from threats of crime, terrorism, and disasters of all kinds.

Citizen Corps partner programs build on the successful efforts in place in many communities around the country to prevent crime and respond to emergencies. Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS) and Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) are two of five Citizen Corps partner programs.



The Chaska Police Department is excited to announce a VIPS and CERT program starting soon. The VIPS Program provides support and resources for the police department and is for citizens who wish to volunteer their time and skills with a community law enforcement agency.



The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community. This program will involve an 8-week training program that will meet two hours per week.

**Chaska Officers issued 33 citations and 19 warnings during this reporting period.
There were 263 calls for service**

DWI:

Officers responded to a residence on Dustin Circle for a male who had several active arrest warrants. The male was located driving his vehicle and was stopped by police. He was intoxicated and failed field sobriety evaluations. His driver's license was revoked and the warrants were confirmed. He was arrested and charged with 2nd degree DWI and driving after revocation.

A male was stopped after he attempted to shoplift numerous items from Super Target. The total amount for the stolen items was approximately \$575.00. He was found to be in possession of marijuana. He was charged for that possession and the gross misdemeanor theft. He does not have a permanent address and was arrested.

Disturbances:

Two juvenile males attempted to steal several alcoholic beverage bottles from the Rainbow Food store, but were stopped by employees. The police were called and both were cited for theft and minor possession of alcohol.

A Chaska Middle School West student was in possession of marijuana, while in school. The male student had hidden the bag of marijuana inside a Dry Erase Marker. He was referred to juvenile court for possession of marijuana.



Officers and paramedics responded to a medical report of an unconscious male, who was found lying on a walking path near Fire Lane. The male awoke, but was incoherent due to being extremely intoxicated. A breath test indicated a .221 BAC. He was transported to a hospital and was cited for underage consumption.

Several people were smoking marijuana on the front porch of a residence on Legacy Lane. An officer responded to the residence after receiving a complaint. A female in the group admitted to having the marijuana and two drug pipes. She was cited for possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.



Police responded to a complaint of a group of juveniles, who had been smoking marijuana in an area near the Chaska High School. A CHS varsity football game was in progress at the time of the complaint. Officers located the group as they were attempting to enter the football stadium. Seven juveniles were in the group and officers could smell burned marijuana. Two males had drug pipes in their possession. Both were cited for possession of drug paraphernalia. Police searched a backpack belonging to a third male. Inside the bag, a large folding "butterfly" style knife was found. The handle of the knife doubles as a set of brass knuckles. The male was arrested and charged with possession of a dangerous weapon on school grounds, which is a felony. He was transported to the juvenile detention center.
